
Check out... Our latest, uplifting Impact Report

Our HIV and AIDS Myth Busting Series Continued:

Myth #2: HIV only affects gay men

HIV can be transmitted to anyone, regardless of sexual preferences. Of the 4,139 people diagnosed with HIV in the UK in 2019, only 41% were gay or bisexual men. Of people receiving treatment for HIV in 2019 in the UK, 46% acquired it through heterosexual sex, the same percentage as those who acquired it through sex between men.

Myth #3: HIV is no big deal nowadays

Medically no. Stigma and discrimination still remain an issue for people living with HIV. 1 in 3 people living with HIV have received HIV-related stigma or discrimination. HIV has not gone away. Every year people are getting diagnosed and in 2019 an estimated 1.7 million people worldwide were diagnosed.
