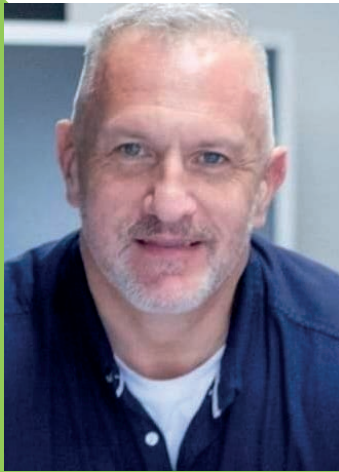


Chaired by Ian Boulton of South Gloucestershire Council, we'll be exploring the challenges faced, and the solutions in working with older and elder LGBT+ people.

Ian has 30 years' experience of working with all levels of the private, public, charitable and voluntary sectors. Paul is a researcher and senior lecturer in social work with adults at the University of Bristol. Over the last 10 years, Paul has led and been involved in a number of research projects looking at ways of providing more inclusive care home services for older LGBT+ people in England and Wales. His research areas include: older men's experiences of loneliness and social isolation; sexuality, care and ageing; trans ageing and gender identity; inclusive care provision for diverse groups of older people; and; LGBT+ youth health and wellbeing.



Dr Wenjing Zhang
University of Kent

A trained social worker, Wenjing is based at the University of Kent, pursuing her research interests in health and social care, ageing and social policy at the Centre for Health Services Studies. Prior to joining the University of Kent, she worked as a research and teaching associate at the University of Bristol. Her research interests focus on ageing and social care for older people, and she has worked across policy- and practice- oriented research projects including the Care Under the Rainbow Project alongside Dr Paul Willis and Berkeley Wilde of The Diversity Trust.
