

The second Somerset LGBTQ Network Event took place on Monday 3rd October 2022 at the spacious Westlands Entertainment Venue in Yeovil. Together, The Diversity Trust, SARI, and Yeovil Diversity Project, hosted the event which focused on the discussion of back series and how back to on the discussion of hate crime and how best to support the LGBTQ community in recognising and reporting incidents.


Sixteen people joined the event, including representatives from The Diversity Trust (Harry Nutt), SARI (Tim Birkbeck) and Avon & Somerset Police (ASP). The Yeovil Diversity Project had created a display showcasing local community events and projects including recent Pride photos, collaborative art, and comments from service users.

users. Harry Nutt (The Diversity Trust) opened the event, introducing the topic of Hate Crime and then handing over to ASP, who explored hate crime statistics relevant to the LGBTQ+ community, and how these have risen in the past five years, examined the different types of hate crime and how they're classified and reported. An open discussion around historic mistrust of the police in the LGBTQ+ community was also held, providing key insights from attendees who are members of the community, and from ASP. This included how to build trust and develop better relationships between the police and the LGBTQ community. The difference between police officers and

The difference between police officers and PCSO's was explored and the LGBT+ Staff Network and Champion systems within ASP were highlighted as a way forward for better community relationships.

Tim Birkbeck presented information about hate crime and the support offered through SARI, citing case studies and example of reporting within the community. Lydia Gardiner from Victim Support provided information about the support for victims of crime.





1. CREATING ENVELOPING SERVICES

Preventative work with young people is foundational to life-long support in the community; joined up with early intervention models, services to support during and after experiences, and then closing the gaps in provision will serve to improve the experiences and outcomes for the LGBTQ community. Particular attention is needed for older and elder populations in the community, as the gaps here are significant.

KEY POINTS

2. Somerset LGBTQ NETWORK

Attendees spent time discussing the next steps for the network, incuding exploring moving operations online, identifying different venues for in-person events, which connect different locations throughout Somerset and are accessible to participants, and creating a cohesive way to communicate. For example, creating an online group and scheduling regular meetups. Collaboration is central to the network developement.

3. SUPPORTING LGBTQ STUDENTS

Addressing discrimination in schools is paramount, Young people and schools, including advice and issues around creating and implementing and policies; older LGBTQ+ people and care; effective and inclusive policy within schools were identified.

4. AREAS TO EXPLORE TOGETHER

NEXT STEPS:

Together, we discussed organising the next meeting for 2023 and proposed that it be held online to increase accessibility across Somerset and allow more people to attend. The key points drawn for the session will be taken forward, with an LGBT+ & Ageing online events scheduled for January and schools' engagement moved into planning.







SEXUAL ORIENTATION


