For the Diary... Our Lunch and Learn Sessions





Spotlight on... Our Latest Podcast Episode, Part 2 of Renee Bracey Sherman on Reproductive Justice



"...[W]e are supportive of people generally who fit a certain mould, that are white, or they're married, heterosexual, have an acceptable abortion story, we show up for them.

But the more oppressions that people have, if they're poor, they're a parent of multiple children, they've had more than one abortion, they're dark skinned, they don't speak English as a language, or they use an accent or a 'blackcent', whatever it is, all of those oppressions show up in how we do, or don't, show up for people, and they become a scapegoat, and the ones that are kicked out of the system and unsupported first."
